
On November 21, we held Chef Day, giving children the chance to try simple food-preparation activities.



JUJU International Preschool joyfully celebrated Chef Day, where our young learners transformed into little chefs and participated in exciting, hands-on food preparation activities. Our Playgroup's tiny chefs explored the basics of kitchen activity by preparing refreshing lemon juice. Children squeezed lemons, mixed sugar and water, and enjoyed tasting the drink they created. This activity strengthened their hand muscles and introduced them to early practical life skills



Nurserv children prepared nutritious flattened rice laddus. They mixed flattened rice with and shaped jaggery the mixture into small laddus. The enhanced activity sensory exploration, coordination, and of healthy awareness traditional foods.







Junior KG students made colourful fruit salads using a variety of fresh seasonal fruits. The children learned fruit names, colours, textures, and the value of healthy eating. Mixing and assembling the salads encouraged independence, confidence, and participation.







PARENT STUDE ACTIVITY





International Preschool JUJU conducted an engaging Parent-Student Activity based on the theme "Food and Nutrition", providing a memorable handslearning experience children along with their parents. Each grade participated in a unique activity aligned with ageappropriate skills, healthy eating habits. and practical life learning.









Playgroup children, with the support of their parents, created fun and colourful fruit or vegetable faces.

Nursery students prepared refreshing lemon juice with their parents. The process of squeezing ingredients, lemons. mixing drink tasting their own helped strengthen fine motor skills introduced children to simple food preparation steps.

Junior KG children prepared healthy sandwiches using fresh vegetables and spreads. Parents guided them through spreading, arranging, and assembling the sandwich. This activity promoted independence, coordination, and awareness of balanced food choices.

Senior KG students experienced the traditional process of churning butter. With parent participation, they shook cream to observe its transformation into butter. This activity deepened their understanding of food origin, physical changes, and the importance of wholesome foods.

Children enjoyed exploring real-life food preparation, developing essential motor skills, and understanding healthy eating practices. The event was highly interactive, enriching, and joyful for every participant.


TEACHERS CORNER




